Eryc Taylor, Artistic Director

Eryc Taylor is the Artistic Director of the NYC-based nonprofit dance company Eryc Taylor Dance, its community outreach program, ETD Outreach, and the New Choreographer Grant program for emerging choreographers. Taylor holds an MFA in Dance from NYU Tisch and has been creating and touring original work in NYC, nationally, and internationally since 1995 and 2006 with ETD, including tours to Mexico and South Korea. For ETDO, Taylor curates and oversees 20+ weekly movement workshops for underserved communities throughout NYC. He has received grants, awards, and government support from NYSCA, LMCC, SVOG, and Dance/NYC. ETD's EARTH (2019) involved past NCG recipients and was featured on the PBS ALL ARTS series "Climate Artists." ETD's first dance film, Uncharted Territory, was conceived and created by Taylor during the 2020 pandemic. It received critical praise and awards and is an official selection at several film festivals. Taylor's Factory/Refractory (2022) draws inspiration from his experiences and observations of the NYC nightlife in the 1990s. The critically acclaimed site-specific immersive dance production was presented at SLATE NY in 2022 and 2023.

In "Fisheye," a desire for physical intensity acts as a vehicle for this experiential extravagance. With movement, our characters generate emotional activity, signifying life through demonstrations of intimacy, discomfort, exhaustion, sensitivity, and yearning.
